The Legacy Lives On: Alumni Narratives



Capt. Ajay Singh Yadav

Former Minister (Haryana) of Finance,
Revenue, Irrigation, PWD, Jails, Power,

Capt. Ajay Singh Yadav, Chairman AICC, OBC Department, a distinguished leader and six-time Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) from Rewari District, Haryana is known for his commitment to the welfare and development of his constituency. Capt. Yadav has consistently played a pivotal role in shaping the region's growth. Being a proud alumnus of The New Public School, Sector 18 B Chandigarh, he brings a disciplined approach to public service, drawing on his leadership skills honed in the armed forces. In a nostalgic conversation with Ms. Neha Thapa, he shared his fond memories with the Founder Principal, Ms. Shanta H. Singh.

When did you join The New Public School?

I joined the New Public school in KG and was a boarder and left in class III. I rejoined the school in 1972 in class VIII and left after class XI in 1975.

Can you briefly tell how your journey has been from acquiring skills at The New Public School and then how it led you to pursue a career in army first and then in politics?

I learnt to be disciplined, punctual and hard working right at a tender age from Ms. Shanta H. Singh, the then principal and the founder of the school. She was very strict and disciplined herself and ensured that the same values are fostered in the students.

Kindly share any of your fond memories with the founder Principal Ms. Shanta H. Singh fondly called, 'Big Aunty'.

Once I along with my friends went to watch movie and got late. When we reached back, knowing that the gates were locked, we jumped the wall only to find Ms. Singh right there to greet us. She asked us if we were monkeys or human beings and asked us to come decently from the main gate. Such was her demeanor that she would not only love and be concerned for her students but instill in them values of self-respect and righteousness which helped her students follow her trail all their lives.

Your life is exemplary –whether it is in terms of serving Indian Army or serving masses in Politics? What motivated you to switch to politics?

My brother-in-law was in army. I got lured to the lifestyle and discipline of army which motivated me to join army. However my father, Rao Abhay Singh Yadav too served three terms as MLA which oriented me towards serving masses and I left army after serving it for seven years.

You took up several social initiatives in Haryana like 'Apni beti, Apna Dhan'. What was that? How did it benefit the society? Kindly mention other such accomplishments of yours.

It was an initiative started by me in my constituency wherein parents of every girl child would receive a sum of Rs 25000 which shall be deposited at the post office and an amount of Rs 25 lakh would be given to them when the girl turns 18. This scheme greatly benefited the poor parents and ensured the education and well-being of the girl child. Apart from these, I worked upon building infrastructure in my constituency wherein a lot of commercial spaces, flyovers, prestigious institutions like colleges and schools were built in my tenure to facilitate growth and upliftment of the masses.

Reflecting on your journey from being a student to your current position, what advice would you give to current students who aspire to pursue a career in forces or politics?

I would like to ask the students to read newspapers, magazines and books rather than spending all their time online as these provide them real wealth of knowledge and experience. we should read as much as possible to attain wisdom and expertise.

The Legacy Lives On: Alumni Narratives

From being a decorated army officer to entrepreneurship, from volunteering himself to serve in the Highest Battle Field in the world, Siachen Glacier to joining Reliance Industries- Col Rommel Rajain, yet another illustrious New Public alumnus has tasted it all. In an interesting conversation with Ms. Neha Thapa, he shares his cherished memories of the school life at NPS.

Can you briefly describe your stint at The New Public School and then how it led you to pursue a career in army first and then as an entrepreneur and finally your joining Reliance Industries as Head of Securities?

I had joined The New Public School in class VII, in the year 1977. The most important skill acquired in school was discipline and respect for time. These two skills are most important to make one successful in any chosen path of an individual.

Kindly recount any experience of your school life at NPS that you often recall.

School, life is one, which you always remember, and cherish each and every moment. One can go on and on with various incidents, playing pranks etc. Besides studies and the discipline and scare of BIG AUNTY, we fondly remember the "LADOOS" on Big Aunty's Birthday, after school, during extra classes, Tea of LALLA tea stall and SAMOSA from Jalandhar Sweets.

Kindly share any of your fond memories with the founder Principal Ms. Shanta H. Singh.

During those days, the building of the school used to be in L shape. Big Aunty's office was the first room and she could get a glimpse of all the classes, just by stepping out of her office. We used to be so scared of Big Aunty that if our teacher asked us to stand out of the class, we would prefer to get beating from the teacher, in the classroom rather than standing out and then get caught by Big Aunty. Though, she was strict, but, at the same time she was very loving. I remember, once after the school got over and all the children were moving towards the gate, I picked up a small pebble and threw it at one of my classmates' bag. Unfortunately, it hit another student in the head and started bleeding. The student reported the matter and I was called at Big Aunty's office. I knew, what was coming, but I, immediately apologized and told her what had happened. She chided me for throwing stones and the next day she called my mother, and told her that though I had hit a child, but, I had accepted my mistake, and did not try to run away from the situation.

It was owing to the love that we received here that almost, 10-12 years after leaving the school, I visited the school with my wife and two year old son, just to make them meet Big Aunty. She was very delighted to meet my wife and son. She played with my son for some time and like a grandmother gave a big hug and "Shagan" to my son.

Though there are a variety of career options nowadays, we often find our students confused about choosing the right stream after X or a career later. What advice would you like to give our students to make an appropriate career choice?

In a way, it is good that students have more fields to look at. In our times, the choice was not much. My advice to students is that they should start thinking about career options from class VII onwards, as these are the most formative and impressionable years, and then take support of school, family and friends to achieve their career goals. They should not come under peer pressure to choose a career.

At times, your father's or elder brother's profession also plays a major role in deciding your profession, but then, a child has to make up his/ her mind, before following the profession of the family.

What are some of the standout features or facilities in The New Public School that contributed to an enriched educational experience?

When we were in school, the main building was under construction, but the Science Labs were the first thing to be made operational, this shows that the focus was on providing the facilities, which facilitates education. However, when I visited the school during the reunion, I found that The New Public School has multiple facilities, whether it's state of the art sports facilities, hostel or Gym, are far beyond one's imagination.

Your journey is diverse in terms of joining army then to entrepreneurship and then joining Reliance Group. What led you to switch professions?

Well, joining Army, was my dream, since childhood. It was my maternal grandfather, who had served the British Indian Army, and my maternal great grandfather, who had also served in the British Indian Army, and was martyred in World War, in the Battle of Basra, in Iraq who inspired me to join the Indian Army. Also my maternal grandfather, had named me Rommel, after the great, German Field Marshal Erwin Rommel Rajain. Later, I took pre mature retirement, in 2007, and wanted to do something on my own, I set up a Garment manufacturing unit after few years I realized, I was not cut for business, so I joined Reliance Industries, as Security Head, and later due to my previous experience of "SADBHAVANA PROJECTS" in the army, was given the responsibility of CSR Head.

Who was your favourite teacher at NPS? What made him/her your favourite?

The New Public School had always had the best teachers. However, Ms Manjit, our English teacher was my favourite, we also attended her marriage and later in the year 1990, I again met her by chance in Banagalore, where I had gone to do an Army course and her husband was my Instructor. She invited me, my wife and son for a cup of tea and we could catch up on school memories.

Whom did you idolize before making a career choice? How close to him/her do you find yourself today?

My idol was Field Marshal Erwin Rommel and my father, who was an IPS officer, so my focus was uniformed service, with more bent towards army.

Science Club



SKILL EDUCATION

Skill-Herbal Heritage

“The future belongs to those who learn more skills and combine them in creative ways.”



The New National Curriculum framework in line with the National Education Policy 2020 focuses on making learning a joyful experience and connecting education with life skills. Herbal Heritage is one such effort to make learning fun filled and enable students know about medicinal plants that are used from generation to generation. India has a rich traditional knowledge and heritage of herbal medicine in the form of Ayurveda. In our school, Herbal heritage is introduced as the skill subject in class VII. In this skill, students were introduced with origin, importance and medicinal properties of Aloe Vera and Tulsi. They learned propagation, harvesting and post- harvesting methods of Aloe Vera and Tulsi. Various home remedies of Aloe Vera and Tulsi were discussed with the students. They learned various methods of using Aloe Vera like Aloe Vera Shampoo, Aloe Vera soap, Aloe Vera face pack etc. They made Tulsi mala from dry Tulsi stems and also learned recipe of Tulsi Tea.



What to do When Doctor is not Around

The Grade 6 skill course focused on understanding common sickness, home remedies for common sickness, wound care and recognizing medical situations that require emergency immediate response. This course allows our students to handle minor sickness confidently at home. Students learnt various home remedies for common sickness like cold, flu, fever ,cough, headache, vomiting, diarrhoea and dehydration etc. Information was given about the medicinal plants that are around us and how these plants can be used for common sicknesses. The further discussion was on their collection and storage. This course also emphasizes on right time to get hospitalization.



Mass Media

In the 2024-25 academic session, the Mass Media skill was introduced in Class 8 to enhance students' understanding of media, communication, and related careers. The course covers various media forms, including newspapers, television, radio, and digital platforms, emphasizing how media shapes public opinion. Students learnt to write news reports, articles, and advertisements, improving their writing and communication skills. 





NPS Alumni Meet 2024
