Round Square Service Project

Project Introduction:

This was the 4th consecutive RS service project in Nathon-Ka-Pura. It is a 60 year old village which has about 100 families or in other words, a population of about 1500 people. The entire village now lives in abject poverty as they lost their main occupation of snake charming due to a government ban on the same several years ago. Seeing the state of affairs in the village, The Scindia School decided to extend support to these villagers in every possible way. School has promoted infrastructural development, hygiene and sanitation, education and health awareness. School has also triggered a positive social change through economic empowerment of village women by teaching certain art work and skills through which they can get a permanent source of income.

This year's project:

There were two simultaneous initiatives that went on during this project. One was to construct a 500 feet long concrete water channel so as to direct the soapy water spilled as an outcome of washing clothes and utensils which kept a large part of the village perpetually bedraggled.

Second was to refurbish the existing toilets in the primary school, and to continue with our initiative of income generating training-cum-production unit for village women.

Project Report:

Six schools namely, Singapore International school – Mumbai, Dhirubhai Ambani International School - Mumbai, Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya- Gwalior, British School - New Delhi, Emerald Heights – Indore, Millenium School – Dubai arrived on the Fort on 18th December. An ice breaking session was organized for them at 5 PM in the evening. The Scindia School delegates too joined them during this session. All the delegates were asked to select a partner of their choice with the condition that the partner must be from another school. All the delegates were then asked to sit in a circle and were supposed to pass on a pillow while the music played on. When the music stopped, whoever held the pillow had to come in the center and introduce his / her partner. Although simple, it did break the ice and the delegates got to know each other.

The project began on the 19th of December. On reaching Nathon-ka-Pura, the delegates were divided into five groups. The 1st group which had the largest number of delegates was assigned the task of constructing the 500 feet water drainage channel. The 2nd group was asked to help in the renovation of school toilets. The 3rd group was held responsible for the women empowerment initiatives in which they had to assist and teach the village women some economically productive skills so that they can earn and contribute in running their homes smoothly. The 4th and 5th group explored the village, interacted with the villagers and conducted a survey on Family Planning methods used by them.

For the next three days i.e. on the 20th, 21st and the 22nd delegates left the Fort for the work site at 8:45 am and the above mentioned work continued with gusto. Delegates endlessly passed tubs full of cement and bricks and continuously cleared big piles of sand and mud lined up on both sides of the water channel. This work was extremely tiring and time consuming. On the penultimate day after lunch, the delegates left for the Jai Vilas Palace to visit the museum. Delegates were aweestruck by the rich heritage and the sheer regalia of the Scindia dynasty, museum and the Palace. They also saw many old weapons and rare artifacts. After returning to the fort the students changed into smart casuals and assembled at the school's Assembly Hall for an interactive session on 'Prioritizing Round Square IDEALS'. Each student discussed and


deliberated on the 6 IDEALS of Round Square and enjoyed the intellectually stimulating session which lasted for more than one and a half hours.

22nd December was the last day of the project. Delegates reached the work site full of excitement and enthusiasm to finish the job at hand. By lunch time all the work was accomplished. The water channel was completed; toilets were refurbished; women's vocational skills were enhanced and social survey too was completed.

Once all the work got over, the groups created their own newspapers which included the factual reports coupled with their personal reflections. Students also wrote inspiring slogans on chart papers to be displayed in the classrooms of the local school. At the closing ceremony, villagers and teachers of local school also joined in to extend their support for this service project. Items, namely the cushion-covers, table-mats, napkins, tea-cozy covers, and duppatas which were made by the women of Nathon-Ka-Pura during the previous four days were also put on sale at the closing ceremony. The eyes of the women could be seen gleaming as their items sold like hot cakes.

Representatives from participating schools shared their experiences of the said project. One thing which was felt across was the immense sense of contribution which the delegates derived from all that was done in the course of the previous four days. All in all it was a successful project which not only accomplished all that was planned but also helped the delegates absorb the Round Square IDEALS in the truest sense.
