The 25th Annual Sports Banquet 2019-20, was held on 29th February 2020 in the Dining Hall at 8 pm. The occasion marked the celebration of the achievements of the students in the field of sports. Mr Rajinder Pal Devgan, a distinguished educationist and sportsman who has served as the Principal of Yadavindra Public School, and also served as an English teacher at The Doon School for almost three decades, was the Chief Guest for the occasion. A tête-à-tête with Mr Stephen Alter

Mr Stephen Alter is an author of non-fiction and fiction, who was born and raised in India, where he grew up as the son of American missionaries. He spends time between his hometown of Landour in the Lower Himalaya and Colorado in the United States. He was born on 15 September 1956 in Mussoorie. He has received many awards for his unparalleled work like the Guggenheim Fellowship for Creative Arts, US & Canada. He had his education from Wesleyan University. Presented below is the interview with Mr Stephen Alter, which was taken during the Scindia Literary Fest.

Staff Editor: Good afternoon Sir.

Mr Stephen Alter: Good afternoon, so what classes do you teach?

Staff Editor: Generally, I teach from Class X to Class XII, but we also go down in the sense that we decide on the ways that we may bring up the junior ones gradually to a senior level...it has to be a gradual process. It is a challenge these days to motivate children to really read. You read stories like, say from the prominent authors of the world, which put you under such a great liking for them that you wanted to read more. That challenge is not there today.

Mr Stephen Alter: It is definitely a challenge. Well, I think the hardest part is getting the students to teaching literature, getting them to read and that has always been a challenge. Certain students would read anything and others would not read, even if you force them to read. No, I think getting students to read carefully and quickly. When people say it is a digital world, I don't buy that. But what I do buy is that people are not reading as carefully as they used to. Students now, in my experience, if it is written on a piece of paper, they take it for granted. You should be able to say-think about it, if what is written in the page is actually correct, if it is biased. Getting them to understand all this. Once they gather, then they start questioning everything and that's great. In my mind if you can get the students to question, then your job as a teacher is so much easier.

Staff Editor: In the curriculum design, in the text that they have; they are not very standardized texts. There is a certain sort of language used by the traditional writers that generates that spark. If it is Tagore or Saki, these days the children don't get to read those stories. When you read such a story, you got hooked on to the writer and you read more stories.

I shall appreciate your kind cooperation in this important endeavour to honour our distinguished alumni.



Mr Stephen Alter: I will again say that there is no easy answer to this. Because for students to read Tagore....he is a wonderful writer but certain elements that may make him sound old fashioned. Even a writer like Saki, but everything is becoming dated. A novel which I am reading is very contemporary. But the character is using Blackberry which used to be ten years ago. Finding writers who are writing today with a very contemporary voice, I think is very important but the problem is they haven't been around long enough for us to evaluate whether those stories are going to be lasting ten years hence or whether they are just something that you know, make the headlines this year and next year they just go off. That's all a bit tricky at times. But I think that if the students can connect it to their own lives in some way, whether it is their family, whether it is their school or the journey that they undertook; that I think becomes relevant and then it creates interest and excitement. But it is very hard. I used to teach in Egypt for several years and one of the courses that I taught was a part of the main curriculum of the university so we wanted to give them the best of some of the great books that had some relevance to them and then there was always a huge debate. Everybody had their own favorite book. But I felt that at the end of the day the books that the children responded to best were thin books and I have always thought that I would love teach a course called 'slender volumes' because then I know that I can get the students to actually read it. If you demanded, say by giving them a three or four hundred page book, it is very difficult to say: "I want you to read this by next week."

Staff Editor: So what are the steps towards learning a foreign language?

Mr Stephen Alter: I am the wrong person to ask because I have never learnt a foreign language and I only know Hindi and English.

Staff Editor: So learning Hindi must have been a foreign language for you.

Mr Stephen Alter: Well, when I was one year old! I learnt both the languages simultaneously. Well I think when somebody goes to a place where that language is spoken, almost exclusively, then it is much easier to learn and pick it up rather than learning it in the classrooms. I am a great fan of comic books because they start you off.
