### Field Trip: 'Geography of Lower Chambal Basin'

13 students of The Geo-Scindia Team namely **Shiv Shah, Shourya Singh, Ayaan Shah, Sagnik Chanda, Dhir Jhunjunwala, Mehul Jain, Nimit Agarwal, Aarni Sharma, Bhavesh Mittal, Abhishek Chauhan, Yuvraj Singh, Raghav Sharma** and **Saharsh Singh**, conducted a field study in the lower

Chambal Basin. The study was conducted on 22nd July 2023. The students were escorted by Mr Anoop V, Mr Mandaar Sharma, and Mr Veerendra Nagavanshi. The team visited the Gharial Breeding Centre at Deori, near Morena. The students interacted with Mr Jothir Dandothiya, the officer in charge of the centre. Students understood the different processes, including captive breeding, egg collection and incubation, hatchling rearing, research, and the eventual reintroduction of gharials into their natural habitat.

The team studied geomorphological signatures like ravines, sedimentation, river action, and erosion and deposition in the Chambal River basin. They visited Baba Devpuri main temple and had lunch in the temple premises. Students also analysed the vegetation, wildlife, healthcare conditions, agriculture, and level of education in the belt. It was an enriching trip wherein students learned geographical concepts on the ground. It helped students improve their decision-making and analytical skills.
