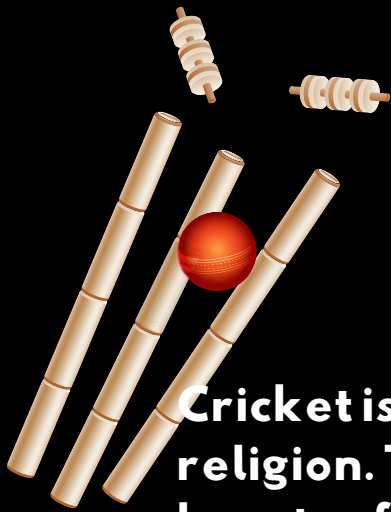

HOCKEY






Hockey in India has a long and illustrious history, dating back to the early 20th century when it emerged as the country's national sport. The sport was introduced to India during the British colonial era, and it quickly gained popularity among the locals.

The beginnings of Indian hockey can be traced to the British Army, who played the sport on the Indian subcontinent. In 1885, the Calcutta Hockey Club was founded, marking the formal establishment of the sport in the country. It didn't take long for Indian players to adopt the game and showcase their innate talent. By the early 1920s, India was participating in international hockey tournaments.

Indian hockey's first major milestone came at the 1928 Amsterdam Olympics when they sent a team to compete. To the world's astonishment, India's team, led by Captain Jaipal Singh, won the gold medal in their debut. This marked the beginning of India's dominance in the sport, a reign that would continue for decades.

Under the guidance of legendary coaches like Dhyan Chand, India achieved remarkable success in the following decades. The 1932 Los Angeles Olympics, 1936 Berlin Olympics, 1948 London Olympics, and 1952 Helsinki Olympics all saw India clinching the gold medal. Dhyan Chand, often referred to as the "Wizard of Hockey," became an international icon for his extraordinary skills and goal-scoring prowess.



Indian hockey continued to flourish through the 1960s and 1970s, with players like Leslie Claudius, K.D. Singh, and Balbir Singh Sr. becoming household names. They contributed to India's gold medal victories at the 1956 Melbourne Olympics, 1964 Tokyo Olympics, and 1980 Moscow Olympics.

Ancient Origins:

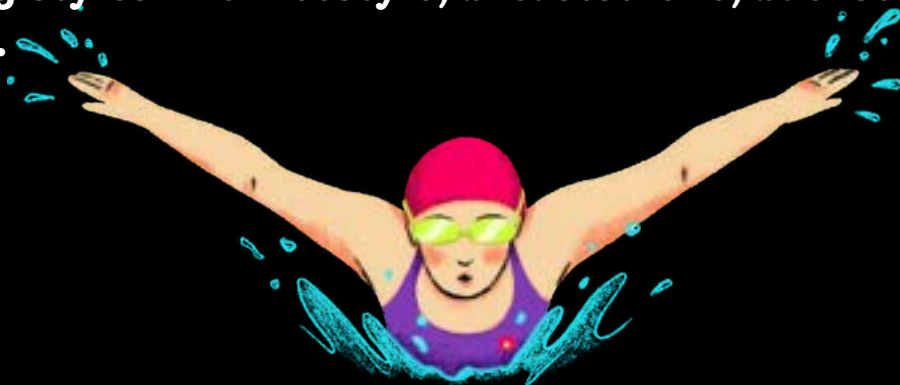
